## **Cross Curricular Activity: Science**

NEW ORLEANS

Lesson: Parts of a Vegetable

Grade Level: 1-3

**Overview:** Students will list their favorite vegetables to discover which parts of the plant they come from.

Approximate Duration: one class period

**National Social Studies Standards:** <u>NS.K-4.3</u> Life Science <u>http://www.educationworld.com/standards/national/science/k\_4.shtml</u>

**Objective:** Students will learn that they vegetables they eat are parts of plants.

## **Procedure:**

- Ask students to list the different vegetables they eat. Write the list on the board for the class to see.
- Explain to the students that the vegetables we eat are parts of a plant.
- Write these heading on the board next to the list: ROOTS, STEMS, LEAVES, FLOWERS, FRUITS, SEEDS

## Assessment:

• Go through the vegetables listed on the board and have the students say what heading they belong under. Some vegetables can be listed under two headings.

Ex: Broccoli belongs under both the stem and flower headings.
